We're back with another annual Motorsport news report, and unfortunately, the final, as I am graduating this year. We have some news to cover so let's get into it.

F1, after being postponed for two years, finally started using their next generation of cars. The new cars changed the aerodynamics of the old cars to reduce drag, make cars easier to follow, and make racing better overall. However, a problem arose called proposing. Proposing is when a car starts to bounce up and down on a high speed straight, which is a problem because the car bouncing causes it to slow down. Most teams were able to fix the problem before the season started, but for Mercedes and Ferrari, they weren't able to fix it in time. When the season started, it was clear that it was going to be a battle between Ferrari and reigning champions, Red Bull. Despite the proposing, Ferrari are leading the championship with two wins in the first five races with driver Charles Leclerc. Red Bull and Max Verstapen have won more races than Ferrari, but due to reliability issues, Red Bull didn't score any points twice, which put them behind in the championship. Mercedes, who finished second last year, were not so lucky. Mercedes have been having their worst season in a while with them struggling to qualify past 6th. Mercedes remains 3rd in the teams championship due to finishing 5th and 6th consistently for 3 races, but going by their previous year's results of seven drivers championships in a row, eight teams championships in a row and a second last year in drivers championship by one point. It doesn't seem like Mercedes are going to have a great season for their standards. Going from a team that went from good to bad, now we're going to discuss a team that went from bad to decent. The Haas F1 team's 2021 season was at worst awful and at best, a 12th place finish by Mick Schumacher at Hungary where half the cars did not finish. Haas's last season was so bad that Nikita Mazepin, a Russian F1 driver, finished 21st out of a 20 car championship because Robert Kubica, subbing for a sick driver, finished in a higher position than he did in two races which was 15th and 14th, that was just how bad the car was. In 2022, because of the Russia Ukraine war, Haas decided to drop Nikita Mazepin as well as their sponsor and replace him with Kevin Magnussen, who had been dropped from Haas last year, and from how he's been performing, it was not a mistake to hire him. Haas has made a new car that is reliable enough to consistently score points and with Kevin and Mick behind the wheel, Haas has a decent shot of scoring a podium this year. Haas currently stands 8th in the team championship with a highest finish of 9th this year. They seem to have potential.

Though we are barely halfway through the year, this season shows that one change or upgrade can change the course of the season, it's almost unpredictable, and that's why I love Motorsport. That concludes the final entry of Motorsport news.
